

Your Cloud By Day - Your Fire By Night

How do *you* get guidance today? How does God guide *you*? How does God lead *you* when you find yourself in a transition or when you're under pressure to make a difficult decision? David, the shepherd king of Israel, was no stranger to transitions. Perhaps more than anyone else in Scripture, he knew what it meant to be in the arid and dry land— sometimes because of his own sin and other times because of the sin of others. David needed clear and direct guidance often. Yet, his confidence in the promises of the Lord remained iron clad as he declared in Psalm 119:105, "Your word is a lamp to my feet and a light to my path."

In the wilderness for 40 years, when Israel needed guidance, they looked up and there it was. A cloud by day and a pillar of fire at night. What a sight that must have been. Today, we find ourselves needing similar guidance. The pillar of fire gave the Israelites light during the night so they could see, it was the "lamp" to light their path. Every day, for 40 years, the Lord provided manna and gave them protection and peaceful sleep by night. Don't we need the same? At all times and in every way the Israelites were sustained and maintained by God, so much so that their clothes and shoes never wore out... for 40 years! We will find ourselves in many similar deserted situations as well, but where will we turn? Will we seek God?

It's often been said that our lives are lived on two fronts: physical and spiritual. You cannot engage one without it affecting the other. David understood this concept as he wrote, "You will make known to me the path of life; In Your presence is fullness of joy; In Your right hand there are pleasures forever" (Ps. 16:11). During transitions, don't make the mistake of turning away from the Lord for answers. God has promised that if we meditate on His Word, He will open our eyes to wonderful things therein (Ps 119:18). For Israel, the transition from Egypt would test them beyond their wildest dreams. The barren wasteland was so depleted and so cursed that nobody dare live there. Nobody would dare cross it. Yet that's where God demonstrated His power and desire to lead them.

Maybe you're looking at a desert and all you see is dry land. No rain has come. Maybe you're staring at darkness and it's not what you anticipated. Remember that God is in the transitions; He will lead you through the difficult passage to the promises of His Word. "Even though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I will not fear...your rod and your staff will comfort me" (Ps 23:4).





- 2. Read Philippians 1: 3-11. What might it look like for your love to "abound more and more in knowledge and depth of insight"? What do you think it requires to pursue that kind of faith?
